The South Suburban Water Works Association (SSWWA) develops and supports people, agencies, and organizations that plan, build, maintain, and improve our water systems. Working together, SSWWA and its membership contribute to a higher and sustainable quality of life.

Awards Available

- Total Budget - \$1,500
- Maximum Stipend Awarded - \$150
- Additional scholarships may be awarded if funding and applicants are available

Eligibility

- Applicant must be a member of the South Suburban Water Works Association (SSWWA).
- Applicant must be employed by public water systems. Contractors, engineers, sales representatives, etc., are not eligible for the scholarship.
- Applicants' employer must not be offering reimbursement for such classes.
- Previous winners of Educational Opportunities Scholarships are not eligible to re-apply for this scholarship.

Judging Criteria

- Applicants will be chosen by a "first come/first serve" basis.

Submittals

- To be considered for a scholarship, the following must be completed and submitted:
 - The General Information Form
